

# Introduction to Biathlon Clinic

The Wisconsin Biathlon Association invites you to come out and learn about biathlon, the Olympic winter sport combining cross country skiing and rifle marksmanship.

## TOPICS:

The basics of biathlon shooting fundamentals will be covered. No previous experience is required. The clinic will consist of indoor presentations along with outdoor instruction and practice at the McMiller Park biathlon range. Attending this clinic will satisfy the safety requirement for participation in future club practices and events.

10:30-11:00: Transfer to McMiller Park Biathlon Range  
11:00-12:30: Shooting Instruction & Practice

## WHAT TO WEAR:

Participants should plan to dress for both indoor and outdoor weather.

## AGES:

Due to Wisconsin state firearm laws, individuals must be ages 12 and older. Parents are welcome to accompany younger athletes.

## EQUIPMENT:

Biathlon rifles, targets, and ammunition will be supplied for use by all participants. Snow permitting, you may bring your ski equipment.
